RE: Greening the Government through Waste Prevention, Recycling, and Federal Acquisitions

Bergeson & Campbell, P.C. is pleased to announce that Lynn L. Bergeson will participate in an Environmental Law Institute (ELI) program entitled “Greening the Government through Waste Prevention, Recycling, and Federal Acquisitions.” This was the stated purpose of Executive Order 13101, which created the Office of the Federal Environmental Executive (OFEE). Under the current Director, John Howard, the mission of the OFEE has expanded to six priority areas: (1) waste prevention/recycling, (2) green purchasing, (3) environmental management systems (EMS), (4) electronics stewardship, (5) sustainable buildings, and (6) industrial ecology/green jobs.

Other program participants include Dana Arnold, Deputy Chief of Staff, White House Task Force on Waste Prevention and Recycling, and Dobbin Callahan, General Manager, Government Markets of Tandus Group; and Chairman, Board of the National Recycling Coalition. The program will include discussion of strategies for achieving these six priority areas with emphasis on expanding “biobased” products, developing new partnerships in the green buildings program, and implementing strategies for integrating more systematically EMSs. Program participants will also offer insights into the growing influence of federal purchasing policies in promoting market change.
